One thing that you may have noticed about the library these days is that most library services can be accessed from your home computer. Using the library's website you can easily get the information you need where and when you need it. We have been out in the community and schools talking to your children and their teachers about remote access and our free online "homework help services." Want more info? ONLINE REGISTRATION

Online registration has finally made it to Brookhaven Free Library. Yeah! That said, it is more important than ever to get your children their own Brookhaven Free Library cards. Online registration is easy and there are some very nice features included.

Simply go to the event calendar from our homepage www.brookhavenfreelibrary.org and scroll through the programs. When you find a program you like click register, enter your barcode and follow the prompts. You will know right away if you are in the program or waitlisted. You can also create an account so you can view all of the programs that you have signed up for and receive reminder emails if you desire.

For now, online registration will begin 15 minutes after we open on registration day. Give it a try. All of the same registration policies are in effect. **Programs that have fees associated with them still require you to register in person at the library. Out of district residents must wait one week before registering.**

MUSEUM PASSES

The museum pass program officially began in September and many of you have already started to take advantage of this fabulous program. For those who may have missed the announcement, I'm still excited to tell you that the library has passes to the following museums; *Cold Spring Harbor Fish Hatchery and Aquarium, Brooklyn Botanic Gardens, Children's Museum of the East End, The Intrepid Air Sea and Space Museum* and the *Eric Carle Museum of the Picture Book*. Each pass is loaned for 3 days and admits several people and children to the exhibits for free.

Passes can be reserved online or in the library up to 60 days in advance. You must be 18 years of age and have a valid Brookhaven Free Library card in good standing to reserve a pass. Please feel free to contact the library 286-1923 if you have any questions.

I realize that this is a lot of information to process and that many people get frustrated with change. Rest assured we are here and ready to serve you in whatever way you feel most comfortable. Just ask us.

Finally, in the spirit of the holidays, the library is adopting a local family in need to help through the holidays. 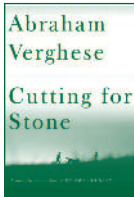

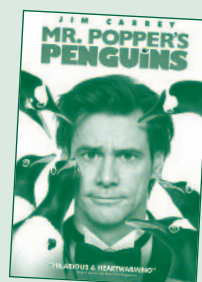
